

WILDLIFE INDUSTRY TRENDS AND ANALYSIS FOR 2023, PRESENTED BY AFRICAN WILDLIFE AUCTIONS



❖ **Key Industry News**

- The 2023 year has seen unprecedented activity in the wildlife market, continuing from what we experienced in 2022. This trend boasts positively for the future of the industry.
- The activity in auctions in the wildlife industry have not seen this buoyancy since the peak periods of the industry during 2014 to 2017.
- We have seen an abnormal increase in enquiries and requests for game since February 2023 through to October 2023 and double-digit revenue growth in our bi-monthly auctions, 2022 versus 2023.
- We have noticed some interesting trends in prices of certain species, increasing at a higher rate of inflation this past year. These price increases are mainly due to the demand of certain species exceeding the supply.
- There is a noticeable shortfall in supply of several species in the market which will continue to impact positively on the pricing of these species for the foreseeable future.
- Prices of certain game species, like Zebra and Giraffe, which have been flat for the last ten years ,has now seen a substantial upward trend this year.



❖ Specific Market Trends related to clients

- AWA, over the past four years, has projected certain changes to the industry in our Annual Game Price Industry Report.
- Those projections and estimates have started to realise the last three years and has an impact on market pricing.
- The dominance of major industry players (and breeders) in the game industry, relative to auctions, have substantially reduced in the past years.
- The impact of this change can clearly be seen in the profile of current active buyers registering for auctions.
- Pre-2020 auctions were dominated by these major players, but the last three years have seen a complete realignment of the market to hunting, small and medium game farmers and new breeders.
- The industry was dominated by these large and consortium game breeders during the periods 2014 to 2018, hosting major auctions and controlling the market spend for up to 85% of the annual revenue in 2017 compared to the low of 47% in 2023, which is nearly 40% down.



❖ **Specific Market Trends related to clients (Continued)**

- We have seen a major change to this trend during 2022 and even more prevalent in 2023.
- The major players are no longer investing as much in the game industry ,as to the extent that they participated in pre-2020.
- Latest estimates and analysis of buyers on auctions indicate that the market percentage spent of these major players have reduced drastically in context to the overall market(85% down to 47%).
- The market spend is now dominated by hunting and small to medium game farm owners and new entries into the game Industry. International buyers of game farms also impacted to this change.
- These farmers(as defined above) contribute close to 80%(Buying on Auctions), of the current industry spend and continue to grow monthly.
- Very interesting is the growth of a new market segment driven by farmers investing in rare game due to the affordability of the current rare game prices.
- It is currently, for example, more affordable to buy certain rare game female cows on auction than Kudu, Redhartbeest and Gemsbuck cows.
- The lower prices allowed this market segment to actively participate, acquire and invest in the rare species market segment, which they previously could not participate in.



❖ Wildlife Industry Trends and Analysis

- The total quantity of animals sold on auction were the highest ever in the industry, in 23 years. The 2023 auction year, sold close to 45 918 animals, improving on the previous highest sales quantity achieved in 2022 which was 39 836 animals and 38 324 in 2015.
- From the boom days in the industry in 2015 and 2016 to a complete change and reset in the market in 2017 with the downward trends continuing in 2018, 2019 and Covid implications in 2020 and massive above inflation increase in three consecutive years since 2021.
- For the third consecutive year(since 2016), we have seen above inflation growth in the wildlife Industry of 2021(58.8%) and again in 2022(33.83%) and 2023 year growth of 38.34% .
- Due to the proliferation of auction houses, it has become more and more difficult to obtain data from certain auction houses and specific auctions. The data we have compiled and present in this document , we however believe is a fair indication of the market trends in the SA Wildlife industry. AWA have to search the internet and website for days to ensure the data are representative of the industry and it takes over a month to compile and find the data from the other auction houses .



❖ **Key statistical data for 2023**

- Certain specie prices increases have been impacted more than others due to the shortages of supply in the market of these species .
- The “Bread and Butter” lines for local and corporate hunting , are currently experiencing the highest demand, therefore also seeing the biggest percentage increase in prices.
- The demand for venison in the market has also increased the pressure on game prices.
- Prices continued to rise on most species since March 2021. We have seen some of the highest prices for certain species during 2023 auction season.
- Buffalo sales made up 26.8%(R157.9m) of value of all game sold on auctions in 2023. Total Value of buffalo sales on auction were back to the values last achieved in 2010. The 2023 period saw a record quantity of buffalo sold on auction and the highest ever in the history, total of 957 buffalo.
- Impala quantities(13 258) sold on auction in 2023 made up 28.9% of all game sold in the year. This is however still below a high of 13 264 impala sold during 2015 but close to the 2015 year.
- Bluewildebeest are now the second most sought after specie followed by Blesbuck. Bluewildebeest increase in quantities by 25% and an average price increase of 32%.

Wildlife Industry Trends and Analysis

- Current market indicators and trends, for all 2023 game auctions, indicate that the market has for the second year in a row, shown a positive growth trajectory and growth has been prevalent in both Rare and Plains Game markets;
- Total revenue of game sales from auctions were as follows:
 - 2018 declined by **39%** to R599m;
 - 2019 declined by **21%** to 472m;
 - 2020 declined by **58%** to R200m;
 - 2021 increased by **59%** to R318m;
 - 2022 increased by **34%** to R426m;
 - 2023 increased by **38%** to R589m, close to the revenue income achieved in 2018.
- Plains Game market grew by a staggering **40%** during 2023(**46%** in 2022) and rare game market by **37%** (**26%** in 2022). The Plains game growth was attributable to a growth in quantities of **12%** and price increases of **25%**. The Rare Game market growth was mainly due to increase in prices of **1%** and a increase in quantities of **36%**.

➤ Total revenue generated from game sales:


- 2017 revenue declined by **47%**.
- 2018 revenue declined by **39%**.
- 2019 revenue declined by **21%**.
- 2020 revenue declined by **57,6%**.
- 2021 revenue increased by **58.8%** reversing the decline of 2020,
- 2022 revenue increased by **33,83%**.
- 2023 revenue increased by **38.34%**.

➤ Total number of animals sold on auction:


- 2017 quantities increased by **2%**.

- 2019 quantities increased by **5%**.
- 2020 quantities declined by **37%**.
- 2021 quantities increased by **61.50%**.
- 2022 quantities increased by **21.58%**.
- 2023 quantities increased by **15.27%**.




Total Revenue for the year



Total Quantity of animals sold per year




Total Average pricing per animal

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





Game Quantities per year per specie



Wildlife Industry Trends and Analysis: RARE GAME



Pricing Trends of game on auction - Rare Game

- Detailed analysis of the rare game prices over the past five years indicated that the trends in the colour variance market are different from the rest of the rare game market.
- Statistical data were analysed in detail per specie, per category for colour variances and rare game species.
- Interesting trends emerged out of these analysis.
- We believe these trends and analysis can assist the game farmers with their planning and marketing of their game in 2024 and in the future.

Colour Variance Market Analysis (Golden Wildebeest, Black Impala etc.)

- Pricing of most colour variance species in 2023 are now at an average of between 5% to 10% of the value received for the same species in 2015/2016.
- These trends are specific to those colour variances that have a growing market for the hunting industry. The 2023 year saw the colour variances being hunted by international hunters which was followed by huge increases in these species year on year.
- 2023 Noted a marked improvement on prices compared to previous years. The demand for colour variances have improved drastically for hunting during 2023. We have seen a marked improvement in demand and prices for these species in 2023. Black Impala prices **increased by 40%** during the year, Saddleback Impala **by 28%**, Golden Gemsbuck **by 40%**, Kings Wildebeest **increased by 70%** and Golden Gnu **by 16%**.
- Livingston Eland prices **decreased** during the year by **8.5%**.

Non Colour Variance Analysis (Buffalo, Sable, Roan etc.)

- Analysis performed with data available indicated that the Sable, Roan and Buffalo species prices have also materially been affected the past few years, although not to the extent we have seen in the colour variant market reductions.
- These species on average are now selling at 10% to 20% of value achieved during the peak of 2015/2016.
- The price of Sable seems to have started increasing again during 2023 and shown mark increased compared to previous years. Roan prices are **decreased by 11%**, Sable prices **increased by 30%** and Rhino **decreased by 18%** on the previous year.
- Prices in the Buffalo sales vary substantially from week to week in 2023, which is a clear indication that the stability in the Buffalo market has not yet settled and will continue to be volatile in 2024. However, average prices for buffalo has **decreased by 12%** on the 2023 year driven mostly by the sale of female animals. Prices of hunting bulls **increased** during the year by **15%**.
- The top end of the market in these species showed a similar trend current to the lower end of the market for these specific species.






Rare Game Market Growth/Decline analysis







Rare Game Auction Revenue per year




Rare Game quantity of animals sold auctions



Rare Game Average pricing per animal on auctions per year



Roan Average price per animal






➤ Roan Antelope

- Roan prices have increased in 2022 for the first time since 2016 but decreased again in 2023. The 2022 increase was the first upwards increase in Roan average prices for 7 years.
- The male and female prices were reasonably stabilised during 2022 but shown a decrease in 2023. Roan prices, on average, **decreased by 10.5%** during 2023 versus an **48% increase** in 2022.
- Currently, females are selling between R15k to R25k depending on the genetics of each animal.
- Exceptional females still get premium prices but not to the extent of the past.
- There is a moderate demand for Roan males/hunting animals. Of all males/hunting animals, the demand for Roans are the lowest of all species.
- Roan males are currently selling between R20k to R40k depending on the horn size and age of the animals.
- We do not see the same trends in Roans as we see in the Sable market currently.




➤ Sable Information

- The price of Sable has on average increased by 30% during this year and continued to increase month on month. The average prices of sables have increased by **10% during 2021** and **49% during 2022** and **30% in 2023**.
- Females are currently selling between R10 000 to R18 000 depending on the genetics.
- We have seen an increase in Sable females from the R8 000 low in the beginning of the year to the current R18 000 on average per female.
- The increase in Sable female prices are directly related to the shortfall of all species in the industry. Sables are not breeding as well in open farms as they did in camps, which is starting to impact on the quantities of sable on auction on upward trends of average prices for males and females.
- Sable bulls prices have increased from R800 per inch to currently trading at R1 000 to R1 200 per inch. Nearly 700 hunting bulls were sold during the year, at an average of R45k to R55k. 2022 Year sold 500 sable bulls at an average of between R35k to R45k, average **25% increase** on 2022.
- Sable bulls with horns of above 46 inches are currently getting a premium price and can be as high as R1 400 per inch.



➤ **All Buffalo analysis(Female and Male)**

- The 2023 year saw the most buffalo ever sold on auction since statistics were kept. A new record of 957 buffalo were sold during the year, compared to the previous high of 783 in 2017.
- The Buffalo market pricing has not yet stabilised. Buffalo prices on average, increased by **22% in 2022** with a average decrease of **12% in 2023**.
- Prices can vary tremendously from week to week, auction to auction.

➤ **Female Buffalo analysis**

- In Buffalo females with similar genetics, prices can vary with so much as 50% per animal. We however , do see a trend developing in the market where Buffalo that are held in boma are achieving better prices than Buffalo sold on catalogue. We believe that buyers want to see the animals and want delivery much quicker than in the past. Buyers of Buffalo are sceptic about quality of animals on catalogue and want to view the Buffalo before committing.
- Buffalo cows, depending on genetics and horn size, are currently selling at R25k for young heifers and between R30k to R40k for adult females. These prices clearly exclude exceptional Buffalo cows on auction with horn sizes above 35 inches.
- With cost of bleeding/testing per animal of between R8k to R10k each, the profitability of Buffalo breeding and selling are very challenging.




➤ Buffalo Bulls Analysis

- Buffalo bulls prices are up between 15% to 25% from the last two years. Nearly 410 buffalo hunting bulls were sold during the year at an average of R165k per year compared to 2022 whereby over 300 hunting bulls were sold at an average of R125k, an **increase of 32%**.
- Only Buffalo bulls older than 6 years with hard bosses are getting reasonable prices.
- Young bulls are battling to get prices in the current market. We believe that with so many bulls in the market, the international PH's and hunters can pick and choose from hunting bulls.
- Hard boss older hunting bulls still get reasonable prices. Bulls older than 6 years with hard bosses currently get prices between R80k and R100k per animal. The horns spread however must be bigger than 38 inches.
- Bulls with horn spread above 44 inches still get a premium price in the market and are currently selling between R130k to R180k.
- We do believe the prices for hunting bulls will increase next year due to international hunters returning to South Africa.
- We believe there is an over supply of Buffalo in the market currently.



Wildlife Industry Trends and Analysis: PLAINS GAME



Pricing trends of game on auction – Plains Game

- Detailed analysis of the plains game prices over the past four years have indicated that the plains game prices continued to increase similar to the trends in the rare game market, with 2021, 2022 and 2023 way above CPI index.
- The plains game market on average shows a dramatic increase in game prices for certain species and above inflation increase in prices for the most sought after species in 2021, 2022 and 2023. Average price increases for plains game were **14% in 2022** and **25% in 2023**.
- Quantities sold on auction increased substantially during the 2015 and 2016 peak but returned to normal quantities in 2017 and **decreased by 23%** in the 2018 season with an **10% increase** in quantities in 2019 and a **38% decrease** in 2020 quantities due to the impact of COVID-19. Quantities for 2021 increased by a staggering **63%, 28% in 2022 and 12% in 2023**.
- Plains Game auction values increased by **94% in 2021, 46% in 2022** and **40% in 2023**.
- Statistical data were analysed in detail per specie per category for all plains game species.






Plains Game Auction Revenue per year



Plains Game quantities per year sold on auction




Average pricing per animal auctions per year for Plains Game


- Most plains game species in 2023 shown an increase in average prices for the year, as well as quantities, similar to the 2022 year, with only **Waterbuck showing a decrease** in prices from 2022;
- Redhartebeest, Zebra, Blesbuck, Kudu and Bluewildebeest were the best performing game based on average prices.
- Kudu bulls prices increased substantially during the year, the average prices for these species at **18% for 2021, 10% for 2022** and a substantive increase of **33% in 2023**.
- Giraffe and Zebra prices increased for consecutive year for the time, indicating the meat market is starting to impact on the prices of these two species. Zebra for the first time in many years prices increased substantially.
- Prices during the last 3 months of the year were on average 15% higher than the start of the year for all species.
- Plains game quantities increased drastically during the year and we estimate this will continue during 2023. Plains Game prices increase by an average of 20% per year over the last 3 years.

Wildlife Industry Trends and Analysis: Summary and Conclusion

❖ Key statistical data for 2023 - Summary

- Plains game prices have increased on average by **19% in 2021, 14% in 2022 and 25% in 2023.**
- Certain species like Kudu cows, Nyala, Waterbuck , Bluewildebeest and Gemsbuck have increased more than 20% year on year.
- There is a huge shortage of bushveld animals currently in the market.
- All male hunting animals are still getting premium prices on auction and we believe this will escalate when the international hunters return next year.
- Buffalo prices continue to be under severe pressure and have not yet stabilised .
- Sable prices have stabilised and we have seen reasonable increase on all Sable categories.
- Roan prices have decreased in 2023 after the first increase in 2022 after 6 years.
- Female plains game is in huge demand and are currently achieving the best prices since the “boom” period.
- Current prices make it profitable for farmers to invest in the industry again.
- Game Farmers will start considering breeding game in camps again, due to the current increase in several species putting upward pressure on certain species.

❖ **Rationale of the increase in prices of certain species**

Several factors impacted on the shortage of supply of certain species in the market. We believe they can be categorised and explained as follows:

➤ Supply shortage created by extensive breeding projects

Several game farm owners converted portions of their farms into breeding camps. This reduced the natural habitat for breeding of certain species. These farm owners also reduced their plains game breeding projects and focused on extensive breeding for rare game species. This impacted the breeding and growth of certain plains game species like Blue Wildebeest females. We believe certain game breeders will start breeding certain species like Roan and Sable in camps again.

➤ Long-term drought in the catchment area

The impact of the last 7 years of below normal rainfall has had a severe impact on some of the species. The shortfall of Kudu cows and Red Hartebeest (to name a few) species can directly be attributed to the last years of drought in certain areas.

➤ Demand for venison meat driven by several factors

The production of venison meat has materially increased in the past three years. There are now several “culling” outfitters that focus on supplying venison to butcheries and the export meat market. This new market segment has substantially reduced the availability of certain species to the auction market and set a new “low” price.

➤ Return of International Hunters have increased the demand for Hunting animals

Several hunting species and specific Sable Bulls, Buffalo Bulls and Kudu Bulls have seen material increase in prices in 2023 and we believe this will continue into 2024 . The requirement for hunting animals is currently exceeding the demand which will continue to put pressure on increase on prices the next few years.



❖ Trend Comparison between Auction and Culling Prices

- Demand for meat/venison has grown exponentially over the last three years. This demand for venison has impacted on the supply to game auctions during the past two years. Weak prices in certain species made it more profitable to cull animals than sell on auctions.
- For species, like Giraffe and Zebra, meat or culling prices are more attractive to game farm owners than capturing and selling on auctions. This trend has however reduced due to the higher prices on auction
- The following table will explain the interaction and impact this has had on prices:

❖ Market Segment Analysis

- Contrary to the decrease in revenue in game auctions since 2017, we have seen a phenomenal increase in new-entry (buyers) in the market.
- First time buyers or new buyer's registrations are up by over 50% year on year at AWA auctions, averaging over 20 new registrations per auction.
- Online registrations growing at a phenomenal rate of 100% per auction on last year's numbers.
- AWA Has on average 90 online bidders per auction, 30 telephone bidders and between 20 to 30 buyers in the hall.
- The average total number of registrations on auction are up by 30% year on year so far.
- Registrations have exceeded 150 bidders per auction this year.
- These registration quantities are substantially higher than the last two years' numbers.



❖ Summary and outlook for 2023

- AWA believes that the current buoyancy in the market will continue in 2024 and the foreseeable future.
- The shortages in species will continue to be prevalent in the market and therefore impact and continue to impact on the game prices for the rest of the year.
- We believe the prices of all species seem to have stabilised except for Buffalo which is not aligned to the rest of game prices.
- We still foresee instability in Buffalo prices for 2024. The Buffalo market pricing is still very unstable, and prices can substantially vary from week to week.
- There are also large quantities of Buffalo for sale in the market. 957 Buffalo were sold during 2023 , of which 50% were sold from AWA Bomas in Vaalwater.
- Most of the game species prices have now reset after the “boom” years and the sellers and buyers of game can look forward to much more stable prices with material increase in certain plains game species and moderate increase year on year for the rare game species.
- We foresee reasonable price increases on most hunting bull prices due to the huge demand from International Hunters returning after Covid. Most outfitters are fully booked for two years in demand. This will put huge strain on the ability to supply the market on a continuous basis for this demand.
- We believe we will continue to see increases in all plains game prices and moderate increases in rare game specie prices.



❖ African Wildlife Auctions Highlights during 2023

➤ AWA auction values and quantities achieved as follow:

- ❑ Close to R90m of game were sold on auction during 2023;
- ❑ Over 10 000 animals sold on auction during 2023;
- ❑ Nearly 400 buffalo were on auction, mostly out of bomas in Vaalwater, turnover of nearly R20m;
- ❑ 1 400 Blesbuck(all species) sold on auction at an average price of R2 930 per animal;
- ❑ 1 755 Wildebeest(all species inclusive of colour variables) sold on auction at an average R8 694 per animal,
- ❑ Bluewildebeest cows sold at an average of R4 600 per animal and Bluewildebeest bulls close to R10 000 per animal;
- ❑ Golden Wildebeest bulls sold at R20 000 on average during the year;
- ❑ 3 966 Impala(all species inclusive of colour variables) sold on auction at average R3 142 per animal;
- ❑ Impala females sold at average of R1 750 per animal and impala rams at an average of R4 800 per animal;
- ❑ Kudu females sold an average of R7 250 per animal and kudu bulls at an average of nearly R33 000;
- ❑ Black Impala rams sold at an average of R15 000 per ram;
- ❑ Redhartebeest bulls sold at an average of R14 100 per bull and females at nearly R9 000 per animal;
- ❑ Zebra saw the biggest jump in prices in a year, sold at an average of nearly R6 400 per animal compare to the previous years of R4 500 per animal;



❖ African Wildlife Auctions Highlights during 2023(Continued...)

➤ AWA auction values and quantities achieved as follow:

- ❑ Kings wildebeest bulls increase substantially during the year. Hunting bulls sold between R50k to R75k per bull;
- ❑ Buffalo hunting bulls sold between R80k to R140k, depending on the horn size and age of animals, average prices for all bulls close to R95k per animal; Bulls prices are now between R2 500 to R3 000 per inch depending on the boss and age;
- ❑ Gemsbuck bulls sold at an average price of R16 500 and cows at R15 000 per animal;
- ❑ Njala bulls sold at an average of over R15k per animal and the females at an average of R5 500;
- ❑ Sable hunting bulls prices were up to an average of close to R40k per animal, an average of R1 000 per inch for all bulls. Female prices increase to R15k per cow;
- ❑ Ostrich prices increased to an average of nearly R6k per ostrich during the year;
- ❑ Waterbuck bulls average prices were between R15k to R20k per bull and the cows were sold at an average of R8k per cow;
